# Interview with Robin Garbose

Chayale Mendelsohn and Yehudis Rivkin: Today we are going to be interviewing the one and only Robin Garbose! Mrs. Garbose, how did you get into filming?

Robin Garbose: That is a long question that spans just about my whole life. I was born into a very acting kind of family. From a young age, I was acting in plays and stuff like that. I studied theater in college and then I went to an English drama school. I then spent several years in New York directing plays and assisting directors on major productions. My mentor in New York had become a major television director and I became interested in making films. Then I began to work on a screenplay that interested me in Yiddishkeit and I began my journey. Most TV shows go on Shabbos and I couldn't work on them anymore. That led me to create Kol Neshama, a performing arts program for frum girls.

YR&CM: That is amazing!! What was the first feature film that you made? What can you tell us about it?

RG: The first feature film I made was A Light For Greytowers. By the time I started on it I had already directed a lot. I've already directed three feature films.

YR&CM: What is your next project going to be?

RG: The next project I'm doing is called Meet The Schustermans. It is a shlichus story. It is a dramedy which means you laugh, you cry, you laugh, you cry. It is the story of Mendy and Mushky Schusterman.





# Interview with... Robin Garbose (cont.)

They are living in Crown Heights and everything is perfect until something happens and they decide to do something with their life that has a deeper meaning. They move to cowboy country and it is their story of all the people that they meet that are Jew-ish. We've been working on the script for 2 years now and anyone who reads it loves it. It is very relatable. It is for general audiences. We have 2 producers on board and we are very excited about it.

YR&CM: I can't wait to see it! Can you tell me some funny things that happened on set?

RG: There are so many funny ones, I'll just tell you what comes to my mind first. In Operation: Candlelight, the heroine of the story sees the terrorist praying. We chose a Sephardic Jew for the part. He spoke fluent Arabic and he did a fake "Arab Prayer" It was so realistic that I and the camera person were trying so hard to keep in our laughter. When I finally called cut we literally fell on the floor laughing. It was so bizarre! Another time a girl had to wolf down a pastry. We didn't rehearse because we wanted it to look like she was doing it for the first time. So there she was, fighting with the cream and everything trying to get her mouth around it. It was really funny. Another time we were using a tunnel that was built for Spider Man™ and as the actor passed through the camera, two bats passed over her head. Now everyone thinks "How did they get that to happen?!!!" We've had snakes on set. We've had acting dogs that cost more per day than the actors themselves! There are always really fun things happening.

YR&CM: That is really funny! What message do you have for the students of Nigri Shluchim Online School?

RG: I travel all over and I always find myself at Chabad Houses. You think you are "just" kids. It is the kids who do the most work. The community sees the adults and say "Yeah, the Rabbi follows the rules because he's a Rabbi." They see the kids and say "I can believe that the kids won't take the candy without asking if it's kosher! That's amazing!" You guys are the ones!

YR&CM: Wow! Thank you so much! Thank you so much for answering our phone call and spending 45 minutes talking to us and telling us all about your life story. You probably get a zillion phone calls a day but you still took time away from your family when we suddenly called without telling you before. Thank you again!!

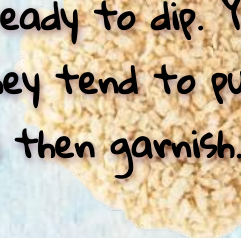
# Baking Corner



## Instructions



1. Combine all ingredients, working the mixture by hand or with a metal spoon until everything is well combined and not sticky. It will become elasticized.
2. Form balls by hand and place on a cookie sheet lined with baking paper

# Rebbe story page



When I (Shmuly Oirechman) was only 4 years old, a metal arrow pierced my eye, on Lag Baomer. I traveled a lot for the next week, flying to hospitals in Florida and Philadelphia for treatment. But all the doctors said the same thing, "It seems that there was a severe damage, as the eye cannot differentiate between light and dark. We don't think there is anything we can do to save it, even surgery. My father and I traveled to the Ohel where we wrote to the Rebbe and asked for a miracle. Meanwhile, at home my mother gazed at a picture of the Rebbe and asked for a bracha. "We need clarity about if we should remove Shmuly's eye or try to save it in a very complex surgery," she said out loud. A moment later my mothers phone buzzed. I heard about what happened to your son, the message read, my name is Asher and when I was 4, I also had a serious eye injury. The Rebbe said not to remove my eye and gave us a dollar for Refuah Sheleima. I will send you the dollar now. I hope it will bring you the Rebbe's bracha." Then a miracle occurred, right after Asher sent us the dollar, a full week after the incident, I started to see light! The next day we traveled to California for the surgery. As they prepared for the operation, the Jewish surgeon put on Tefillin, and placed the Rebbe Dollar in his pocket. Baruch Hashem, the surgery was a huge success. "It's a real miracle," the surgeon said. My story isn't over yet. I still have to go through more treatment, but I am so grateful that I have my eye! I treasure the Rebbe Dollar I received and look forward to more good news Im Yirtzeh Hashem

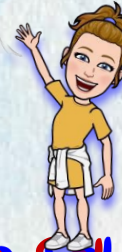

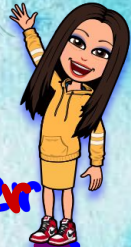
