


Ushpizin: מיטעלער רבי, יצחק אבינו

Once a week on מוצאי שבת in the אידן, בית מדרש, בית מדרש would gather, and would make *Pannes*– a hot drink made with boiling water, vodka, and sugar. They would set up the drink and everyone was warmed up. Then, the חסיד Reb Ahron of Dokshitz, known as Reb Areh would teach חסידות.

Once a year Reb Areh would travel to Lubavitch to the רבי מהר"ש. On מוצאי שבת following his return, the weekly חסידות\Pannes ritual would swing into high gear: an extra large batch of Pannes was concocted, and Reb Areh, fresh from a month of spiritual refueling in Lubavtich, would review the teachings which he had heard from the רבי during his stay. Once, when Reb Areh was in Lubavitch, the רבי said to him: "I hear that in Dokshitz they study חסידות with Pannes Tell me, what's the connection between חסידות and a Samovar of Pannes?" So when Reb Areh came home, he announced that now it would be an only חסידות event with no Pannes. Slowly, the amount of people coming became smaller and smaller and continued to dwindle throughout the winter. When Reb Areh came back to Lubavitch, he was forced to report to the Rebbe that a very small amount of people were now joining. "Nu," said the רבי, "So bring back the Pannes. 




Day Five:
