UNDERCOVER BROWNIE MIX

Ingredients:

10: Say Al HaMichya (cuz just like Avraham Avinu, if you don't thank Hashem, you gotta pay for it!)

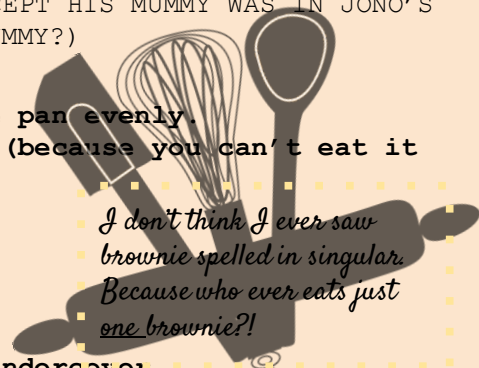

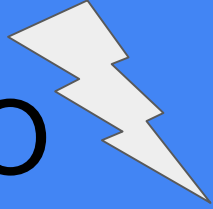

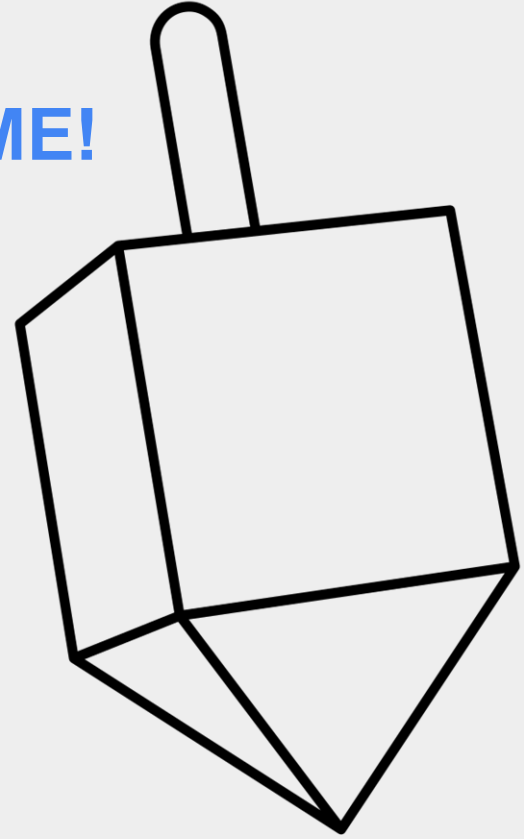

HOW TO MAKE A DREIDEL

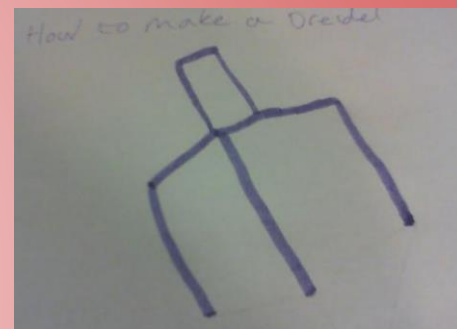
1: Make a rectangle shape



2: 3: follow the pictures to get picture 3, results



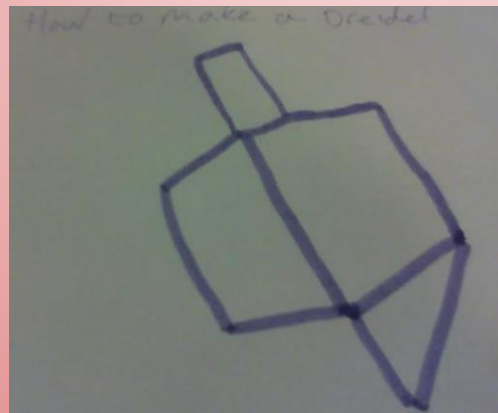
4: point lines down the pointed spots



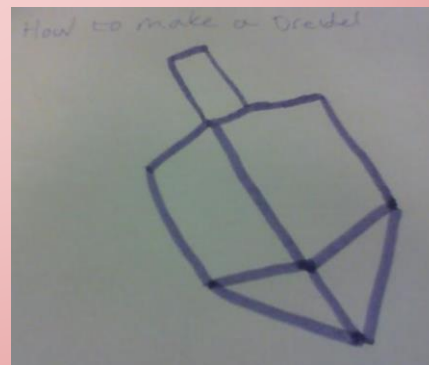
5: close the gaps as seen below



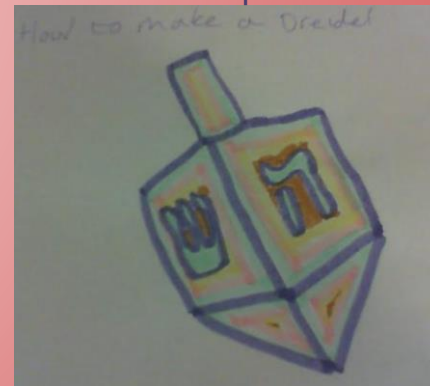
6: Make a triangle shape as seen below
